

Immigration Bulletin – 01/2025

The purpose of this immigration bulletin is to provide a monthly snapshot of significant regulatory updates with respect to entry requirements and common errors recorded while performing document verification during our operations. It aims at promoting awareness, minimizing the risk of future operational issues at airports, and reducing fines and costs associated to possible mistakes. DESTINATION LIBIA

Passports and other documents accepted for entry must be valid on arrival, except for nationals of Libya.

Most nationals holding an ordinary passport are required to hold a **visa**.

Passengers claiming eligibility for a **visa on arrival** at Mitiga International Airport (MJI) **must** have a **No Objection Certificate (NOC)** issued by the Chief Immigration Officer at MJI.

Any NOC from sources other than MJI immigration **may not** be accepted.

This process applies only to **arrival passengers claiming visa on arrival** who do not have:

- ✓ a visa issued by any **Libyan Embassy**
or
- ✓ a valid **resident permit visa**.



Passports containing an **Israeli visa** or stamp **will not be accepted** for entry into Libya. Passengers holding such passports, visa or stamp even in an old passport will be refused entry and the airline will face fines as per Libyan immigration regulations.

Chief Immigration Officer at MJI has reported cases of **fake visas** or **forged forms**. Particular scrutiny will be applied to passengers from the following nationalities:

- ✓ **Bangladesh**
- ✓ **Pakistan**
- ✓ **Syria**
- ✓ **Egypt**
- ✓ **Nigeria**
- ✓ **Sri Lanka**
- ✓ **India**

Exercise caution and verify the authenticity of documents. Any suspicious cases must be immediately reported to ITA Airways "Centrale di Sicurezza Aerea".
