Dear Ground Service Providers,

Due to the new CDC regulations on bringing dogs **into the USA from August 1st**, we are now enforcing a mandatory procedure for accepting dogs traveling **as carry-on baggage in the cabin (PETC), in the cargo hold (AVIH) and as service dogs (SVAN)**. Please read and adhere to the procedure strictly. Compliance is required for all travelers.

1. ALL dogs (PETC, AVIH, SVAN) traveling to the USA by air must:

- appear healthy,
- be at least 6 months old,
- be microchipped,
- possess confirmation of the necessary rabies vaccinations,
- be accompanied by a **CDC Dog Import Form receipt**. → While this form is a requirement for all dogs, importers of dogs from high-risk countries must complete more questions and upload a photo of their dog.

2. The general requirements have been refined by the CDC into three categories of dogs according to the country of origin:

This is the long version of the receipt with more questions plus photo AND • <i>Certification of Foreign Rabies Vaccination and Microchip</i> form + a valid serology titer (not required if dog has reservation for 28-day quarantine at CDC-registered animal care facility [ACF]) AND • Reservation confirmation for a CDC-registered ACF. For LOT Polish Airlines, these will be: JFK, LAX, MIA. We do not transport dogs of this category to: EWR, ORD. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>CDC Dog Import Form</i> receipt: Single entry only on date of arrival listed on receipt. • <i>Certification of Foreign Rabies Vaccination and Microchip</i> form: valid for 30 days from date of issuance and for single use. 	An airport with a CDC-registered ACF, as long as it matches POE on <i>CDC Dog Import Form</i> receipt. The flight must land and the dog must clear Customs at the port with the ACF.

- The documents must be submitted by the passenger to LOT no later than 48 hours before departure.
- **Please note that due to CDC requirements, dogs foreign-vaccinated from high-risk countries can only be accepted on flights to three airports in the USA: New York (JFK), Los Angeles (LAX) and Miami (MIA).**

3. Handling Agent at check-in counter must verify if:

- there is a confirmed **SSR code (PETC, AVIH, SVAN)** in the PNR,
- an importer of the dog possesses each required document,
- the documentation has not expired,
- the documentation is consistent across all documents if dog has multiple documents* (e.g. the description of the dog's breed, microchip number, coloring, etc., is the same across all documents),

* Dogs from dog rabies-free or low-risk countries will only have one document **the CDC Dog Import Form receipt**, and thus not have any other documents to compare against.

- dog appears healthy:

Signs of illness or injury in dogs may include:

- Not moving or not responding to stimuli (e.g., sounds, commands, owner's touch)
- Vomit, diarrhea, or blood in kennel
- Loss of balance
- Significant hair loss or rash
- A lot of mucus around eyes or nose
- Foam around the mouth
- Difficulty breathing
- Unusual behavior



Do not touch or handle a sick dog. Deny boarding if dog is not healthy.

- dog is microchipped (the agent confirms the microchip number only on the documents whether the information is consistent – the microchip code is indicated on the CDC Dog Import Form receipt and the Government-endorsed veterinary documentation),
- dog is at least 6 months old (the agent confirms the age on the documents whether the information is consistent, the agent is not obliged to assess the age of the dogs on the basis of a physical examination).

4. Handling Agent must deny boarding a dog in the event of:

- no confirmed SSR code (**PETC, AVIH** or **SVAN**) in the PNR,
- documents not submitted to LOT 48 hours before departure,
- missing documents,
- expired documents,
- incomplete documents,
- information in documents not matching other documents or not matching dog's appearance,
- dog appears unhealthy,
- dog is not microchipped,
- dog is younger than 6 months old,
- lack of required rabies vaccinations.
