**Dear all,**

**Please pay attention to the following information from immigration:**

Good afternoon,

I am contacting you as we have recently seen an increase in the number of Afghan (AFG) inadequately documented passengers who are attempting to or have successfully travelled to the UK. We have seen this activity primarily at Düsseldorf and Munich airports however we believe there is a high possibility of the abuse spreading to other airports.

There are a number of associated risk indicators that we would like your frontline teams to be made aware of.

**Risk Indicators:**

- **Travelling on Indian or Canadian counterfeit passports**
- **Potential onward connecting flight to India or Canada**
- **Travelling in a family group (3 to 5 people)**
- **Family names of KAUR and SINGH have featured**
- **Late booking**

An example of the counterfeit Canadian passport used is below:



A detection point is the laser perforated number (highlighted in red on the passport). This laser perforation should be neat with even spaces between each hole, on the counterfeit this is not the case as highlighted below (counterfeit highlighted red and genuine in green)

The top line on the “T” is not straight and the perforated holes are not evenly spaced
