We are pleased to announce that, as of June 30-2025, Oman Air will become a full member of the **oneworld** alliance. Updated sections in the Guest Service Manual (GSM), including **oneworld** updates, lounge access, baggage allowance on OA tickets, and excess baggage charges under the piece concept, are attached with this notification. This information will be included in the next main revision (Rev3) of the GSM.

Note: We will begin recognizing top-tier guests at the **oneworld** alliance tier level and providing applicable service benefits starting **from June 18, 2025**.

ASM are advised ensure that all frontline staff are briefed accordingly and adhere strictly to these updates to avoid any inconvenience to our elite tier guests.

This GON is issued under the authority of the Function Head – GO and is applicable to hub and network airports.

As of 30th June 2025 Oman Air is a full member of the **oneworld** global airline alliance. **oneworld** is a premier airline network comprising leading carriers from around the world, offering extensive connectivity and premium service across over 900 destinations in more than 170 countries and territories.

WY will begin to recognize top tier guests at **oneworld** alliance tier level and provide applicable service benefits effective **18th June 2025**.

3.3.2 Member Airlines

* The extra baggage allowance will be applicable to all fare types, including Super Saver, for Sindbad GLD& SIL members, as well as Other Airline EMD, SPH, and RBY members.

Note:

Members of other **oneworld** airline frequent flyer program with the RBY tier status are not entitled to lounge access. However WY Silver (RBY) are eligible for lounge access on WY operating flights, regardless of cabin.

EMD and SPH members may invite one guest to join them in the lounge, the accompanying guest must also be traveling on a flight operated by a **oneworld** carrier.

3.3.5 Involuntary Upgrade Matrix

The following matrix outlines the priority order for involuntary upgrades. These upgrades shall be granted based on elite tier status when operational needs arise such as overbooking or equipment change.

1. WY Gold (SPH)
2. Other Airline Emerald (EMD)
3. Other Airline Sapphire (SPH)
4. WY Silver (RBY)
5. Other Airline Ruby (RBY)

3.3.6 oneworld tier levels on Sindbad frequent flyer card

- The Sindbad frequent flyer card will display both the Sindbad and **oneworld** tier.
- Sindbad Blue card will not display any tier.

3.3.7 Earning oneworld Tier Status and Award Miles

Eligibility for Status Points and Miles

Guests traveling on **oneworld** flights (flights operated and marketed by a **oneworld** carrier) are eligible to earn tier status points, miles, or award miles in the frequent flyer program (FFP) card of any **oneworld** airline presented by the guest for that particular flight.

Tier Qualification Criteria

Tier qualification criteria are defined by each individual airline's FFP. For example:

- A Sindbad member can fly on QR or any other **oneworld** carrier, the flight will count towards their tier criteria in the Sindbad program.
- Similarly, a QR or any other **oneworld** member can fly on WY, the flight will count towards their tier criteria on the respective host FFP program.

Code-share Flights

Guests traveling on code-share flights (e.g., marketed by WY and operated by another **oneworld** carrier) collect miles according to the rules of the guest's frequent flyer program.

Restrictions

Guests are not allowed to receive tier status points, miles, and award miles for the same flight in more than one frequent flyer program.

3.3.8 System Configuration for Tier Level Recognition

The DCS (DW and Interact) is programmed to automatically display both the **oneworld** and WY tier levels.

3.3.9 Tier Level Discrepancy Handling

In case the system displays a lower tier level and the guest presents a valid digital card indicating a higher tier, follow these steps:

- **Honour the valid Digital FFP Card:** Acknowledge the higher tier level as shown on the digital card.
- **Provide Corresponding Benefits:** Offer benefits according to the higher tier level.
- **Add Comment in DCS:** Record the details of the digital card in the DCS to prevent unauthorized excess baggage and seat fee waivers.

If the system displays a higher tier level and the guest presents a digital card indicating a lower tier, follow these steps:

- **Honour the System FFP Tier:** Acknowledge the higher tier level as shown on the DCS.
- **Provide Corresponding Benefits:** Offer benefits according to the higher tier level displayed by the system.

This procedure applies to members of Sindbad, **oneworld** , and other partner airline programs.

3.3.10 oneworld Baggage Policy and Procedures

3.3.10.1 Introduction

This section outlines the baggage policies and procedures for **oneworld** member airlines. The **oneworld** alliance is committed to delivering seamless service for customers and their baggage as they connect across the network.

3.3.10.2 Definition of oneworld Through-Services

Through services involve the guest and their baggage being through-checked to their final destination, including boarding passes for the entire journey and bags tagged to the final destination. Guests that are through-checked shall be looked after in times of disruption, in line with IATA Resolution 735D and **oneworld** requirements.

Scenario Examples:

- **Single ticket number for the interline journey:** Through check-in obligation applies.
- **Two tickets issued for the interline journey, linked in a single booking/PNR:** Through check-in obligation applies.
- **Two tickets for the interline journey created in two booking/PNRs:** OK to accept by manually adding baggage routing in DCS.

3.3.10.3 Transfer Baggage

Guests traveling on a **oneworld** itinerary, ticketed and booked in a single booking/PNR, will have their bags through-checked to their final destination. Specific guidelines apply for international to domestic flights, Jetstar, Vueling, and layovers more than 24 hours.

- **International to Domestic:** Guests must be advised to collect their bags upon arrival, clear customs, and then re-check their baggage to their final domestic destination (If applicable)

- **Jetstar:** For any **oneworld** codeshare/interline journey involving a connection to a Jetstar (JQ) flight operating domestically within Australia, bags shall only be tagged as far as the international gateway. Bags may not be interlined onto domestic JQ services.
- **Vueling:** For any **oneworld** codeshare/interline journey involving a connection to a Vueling (VY) flight - bags should only be tagged as far as the international gateway. Bags may not be interlined onto VY, or IB5000 sequence flight numbers.

3.3.10.4 Interline Excess Baggage and Electronic Miscellaneous Documents (EMDs)

Excess baggage charges shall be calculated and collected at the point of origin. **oneworld** carriers use a 'charge-and-keep' solution for excess baggage fee handling.

Processes & Examples:

- **Charge and Keep:** Receipt is given to the guest, accepted by the onward carrier, and no proration or recharge occurs. Issuing agent shall add full routing in the remarks.

If a guest is undercharged or not charged for excess baggage on a **oneworld** interline itinerary, due to an error, omission or waiver by staff at the point of origin, the guest will not subsequently be charged at their connection point.

This policy is only applicable to same-day connecting flights (within 24 hours), where the guest has been through-checked to their final destination.

For stopovers/connections exceeding 24 hours, the guest must check in for the onward flight. In this case, the check-in at the connection point will be treated as the point of origin, and applicable excess baggage charges to the final destination are applicable.

3.3.10.5 Priority Baggage Delivery

3.3.10.5.1 Priority Baggage Delivery

Check in agents shall ensure reciprocal priority baggage handling for Business Studio, Business class and **oneworld** Emerald, Sapphire and Ruby guests traveling in any cabin.

These guests shall have their baggage tagged (with a **oneworld** priority tag – refer to the image below) for priority loading and delivery .

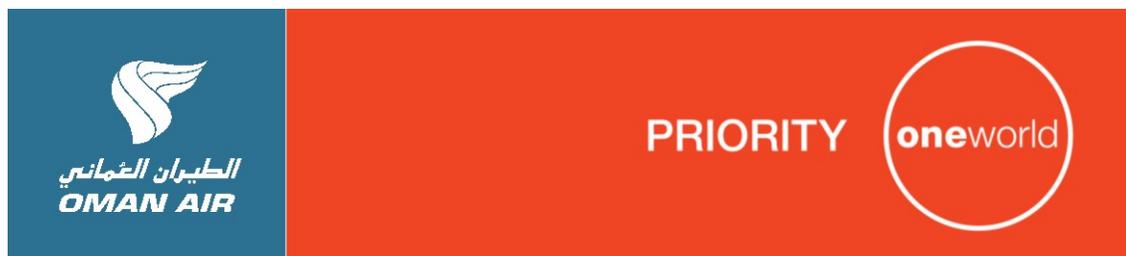


Figure 3.3.10.5.1-1:

2.11 Lounge Access

2.11.1 Lounge Access

Oman Air Lounges are a major selling tool in our brand product and in order to maintain the exclusivity of the product, entrance to the lounges need to be tightly controlled. The policy below will ensure that the product maintains its excellent reputation and does not get diluted by non-eligible persons being admitted.

2.11.1.1 Authority for Granting Access

Authority for granting access to the Lounges, rests with the following personnel only;

Oman Air Premium Lounges at Muscat International Airport

1. First Class Lounge
 - CEO or his nominating acting deputy
 - CCO (Chief Commercial Officer)
2. Business Class Lounge
 - CEO or his nominating acting deputy
 - CCO (Chief Commercial Officer)
 - SVP-Sales (Senior Vice President Sales)

2.11.1.2 Entitled for First Class Lounge (where available)

Following guests are entitled;

- **oneworld EMD +1** guest when traveling on any **oneworld** operated flight.

2.11.1.3 Business Class Lounge Access Eligibility

Following guests are entitled;

- Guest ticketed in WY Business Studio and Business Class. (See below for staff travel exceptions)
- **oneworld EMD** and SPH (including WY GLD) **+1** guest when traveling on any **oneworld** operated flight.
- WY Silver **+0** guest when traveling on WY operated flight only.
- Lounge access is applicable for guests traveling in a premium cabin (First, Business Studio or Business Class) on a **oneworld** international long-haul flight^{***}, connecting to or from a **oneworld** international short-haul or domestic flight, shall be eligible for lounge access at all departure points. Lounge access rules applicable to First, Business Studio and Business class travel on the international long-haul flight apply regardless of the ticketed class of travel on the international short haul or domestic flight. **For Example SLL-MCT-LHR, SLLMCT in Y cabin and MCTLHR in J cabin.**

- Guests who have purchased an ancillary cabin upgrade.
- CEO, EVPs and SVPs of Oman Air and their immediate family members.
- VPs and Senior Managers holding firm Business Class tickets whilst traveling on Duty trips or Annual Leave (with priority codes B04, B05 and B06) and their family members.
- Upgrades authorized by following persons are eligible for lounge access regardless of the seat availability in business class.
 - CEO or his nominating acting deputy
 - CCO (Chief Commercial Officer)

*****A oneworld international long-haul flight is defined as an international flight on any oneworld carrier with a scheduled flight time greater than 5 hours in duration.**

2.11.1.4 Entitled for Lounges in Other Stations

The authority and entitlements described above is applicable for other contracted lounges in outstations.

4.2.9 Baggage Allowance On Other Airlines

4.2.9 Baggage Allowance On Other Airlines Ticket

Most VCRs have specific baggage allowances already displayed. These are taken from a central system, into which airlines have added their respective baggage allowances. These are the allowances which should be allowed during check-in.

Due to parity in free baggage allowance policies between airlines, IATA introduced a “Most Significant Carrier (MSC)” concept to process free baggage allowance. The most significant carrier is the one whose baggage allowances that will be published in the interline line ticket, that must be followed by check-in agents. The Most Significant Carrier is defined as the one which performs carriage on the first sector that crosses from one area to another or the carrier which performs carriage over the Atlantic.

Staff may encounter the missing baggage allowances on the VCR. In such cases, the outlined allowances apply:

Weight Concept:

- Economy Class : 20 Kg
- Business Class : 40 Kg
- Business Studio: 50 Kg

Piece Concept:

- Economy Class : 01 PC (Up to 23 Kg)
- Business Class: 02 PCS (Up to 32 Kg)
- Business Studio : 03 PCS (Up to 32 Kg)

Any weight beyond these allowances must be charged at the applicable weight concept or piece concept.
