



Topic: Dog Importation into the USA

Dear all,

The Center for Disease Control of the United States has implemented new guidelines for the transportation and entry of dogs into the USA. These guidelines apply to all dogs traveling as PETC, AVIH, or SVAN.

For the check-in, the standard animal acceptance procedures must be followed. The major change will be confirming that the passenger has the CDC Dog Import Form receipt. Check-in staff should consider the following about the dog:

- Appear to be in good health
- Be at least six months old
- Be microchipped
- Be in possession of the CDC Dog Import Form receipt

The CDC Dog Import Form receipt appears as below:

This receipt is valid for 6 months from the date of issuance for the dog listed below.

This receipt may be used for the dog listed below for multiple entries to the United States from **low-risk or rabies-free** countries. If the dog has been in a high-risk rabies country since you submitted the Dog Import Form, this receipt is no longer valid for entry and you must complete a new Dog Import Form.

You must show this receipt (printed or on your phone) to airline staff and/or U.S. port of entry officials. CDC reserves the right to request additional documentation verifying the information contained in this receipt upon arrival in the United States.

CDC Final rules for dog importation in USA

Above the wing

Premise In order to limit the spread of canine rabies, the U.S. government agency CDC (Center for Disease Control and Prevention) will implement new guidelines for the transportation and entry of dogs into the United States starting August 1st. These guidelines apply to dogs traveling with passengers (PETC/AVIH/SVAN) as well as those transported as cargo. In addition to the current regulations, passengers are required to complete a specific form through the CDC website (link provided below). The receipt of this form must be presented and verified at check-in to allow or deny the passenger's boarding. The receipt will explicitly authorize the passenger for the transportation and entry of the animal into the country under certain conditions. The regulations categorize countries of origin into:

- Countries with low or no risk of canine rabies transmission
- Countries with high risk of canine rabies transmission

This communication aims to guide airport operators in the necessary checks on the requirements and documentation needed for the transportation of animals to the United States.

Effective date August 01st, 2024

Procedure A passenger intending to travel to the United States with a dog must have previously completed the 'DOG IMPORT FORM' available on the CDC website (CBP.gov/travel) and must have received the mandatory transportation authorization (CDC DOG IMPORT FORM RECEIPT).

➤ **Scenario 1:** Dogs coming from rabies-free and/or low-risk countries:

- **Appear to be in good health**
- **Be at least six months old**
- **Be microchipped**
- **Be accompanied by an online submission receipt of the CDC Dog Import Form (Dog Import Form receipt)**

The DOG IMPORT FORM receipt is valid for a single dog for multiple entries into the United States within 6 months from the date of issuance. Entry into the country is allowed from any POE (Point of Entry) The POE is not mentioned in the Dog Import Form receipt.



- **Scenario 2:** Dogs coming from or having stayed/transited in high-risk countries for canine rabies transmission in the 6 months prior to the travel date to the United States, which have been vaccinated against rabies in the United States:

- **Appear to be in good health**
- **Be at least six months old**
- **Be microchipped**
- **Be accompanied by an online submission receipt of the CDC Dog Import Form (Dog Import Form receipt). In this case, the receipt will be a longer and more detailed version than that required for Scenario 1 and must include a photo of the animal along with one of the following documents:**
 - **Rabies vaccination certificate issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), or**
 - **USDA-endorsed export health certificate, valid for multiple entries for 1 or 3 years, depending on the vaccine administered (option valid if leaving the United States before July 31, 2024)**

N.B: Both of these documents are valid for multiple entries from 1 to 3 years depending on the characteristics of the rabies vaccine.

For Scenario 2, the CDC DOG IMPORT FORM receipt will be valid for a single entry into the United States for the arrival date stated on the receipt. Entry is allowed from any POE (Point of Entry) as long as it matches the one declared in the DOG IMPORT FORM RECEIPT

- **Scenario 3:** Dogs coming from or having stayed/transited in high-risk countries for canine rabies transmission in the 6 months prior to the travel date to the United States, which have been vaccinated against rabies outside the United States:

- **Appear to be in good health**
- **Be at least six months old**
- **Be microchipped**
- **Be accompanied by an online submission receipt of the CDC Dog Import Form (Dog Import Form receipt). In this case, the receipt will be a longer and more detailed version than that required for Scenario 1 and must include a photo of the animal along with the following documents:**
 - **Certificate of 'Foreign Rabies Vaccination and Microchip form', valid for 30 days from the date of issuance and for a single entry**
 - **Valid rabies titer test certificate (not required if the dog has a reservation for a 28-day quarantine)**
 - **Confirmation of reservation at a CDC-registered animal care facility (ACF), which can be found through the link: www.cdc.gov/acf**

For Scenario 3, the CDC DOG IMPORT FORM receipt will be valid for a single entry into the United States for the arrival date stated on the receipt. Entry is allowed only if the POE is at an airport with an accredited ACF and the arrival POE matches the one declared in the DOG IMPORT FORM RECEIPT.



Currently, within the ITA Airways network, the entry of dogs into the United States is not possible at:

- SFO (San Francisco)
- ORD (Chicago)
- BOS (Boston)

Currently, ACF centers within the ITA Airways network are only available at JFK, MIA, IAD, and LAX.

If a country or political unit is NOT listed below, it is NOT considered high-risk for the importation of dogs into the United States. The list of countries considered high-risk for transmission can be found at the following link:

For full compliance with the new regulations and for the well-being of the animals, all airport operators are required to carry out the above checks with the utmost care, in order to avoid possible inconvenience to passengers and their animals (PETC/AVIH/SVAN) up to the potential denial of entry into the United States

Other further information:

- A. **If the dog is only transiting through a high-risk country before entering the U.S.:** Dogs do not need to meet U.S. entry requirements for dogs that have been in a high-risk country if they are transiting through a high-risk country as cargo. Dogs transiting through a high-risk country as hand-carried or excess baggage **MUST** meet the requirements for dogs from a high-risk country to be eligible to enter the U.S.
- B. **If the dog is only transiting through the U.S. to go to another country:** Dogs do not need to meet U.S. entry requirements if they are transiting through the U.S. as cargo. Dogs transported as hand-carried or excess baggage **MUST** meet the requirements for U.S. entry to be eligible to transit through the U.S. on their way to another country.

This operational communication does not mention the pre-requisite of the Airway Bill (AWB) as foreseen, since IA Airways has requested a waiver from the CDC
