Reason for Issue

The easyJet pack safely signage has been updated to state e-cigarettes must be switched off and that charging is prohibited onboard the aircraft.

Details

Version 1.2 is available on the connected portal and all stations will receive the new signage from Cubiquity in the coming weeks.

Stations must remove and destroy the old pack safely signage and replace with version 1.2 once received.

PACK SAFELY

easyJet

Permitted in cabin baggage only

- e-cigarettes (must be switched off and charging onboard is strictly prohibited)
- Power banks
- Loose or spare lithium batteries (for phones/laptops/cameras and other devices)

Smart luggage
(Luggage fitted with lithium battery or power bank)
If the lithium battery/power bank cannot be readily removed, the smart luggage will not be accepted for carriage
Please note: The lithium battery/powerbank must be removed before bag drop if carried as hold luggage

Permitted on your person only

- Matches & cigarette lighters (one box of safety matches or a single lighter is permitted)

Permitted in hold luggage only

- Liquids over 100ml
- Blunt instruments
- Sharp objects
- Work tools & accessories
- Firearms & ammunition (including toys, replicas and other weapons) These must be declared & packed separately

Forbidden for carriage

- Acids
- Explosives
- Flammables
- Bleach & corrosives
- Compressed gas
- Stunning devices
- Magnetic
- Radioactive
- Oils & paints
- Ignitable gas devices
- Toxic & infectious substances
- Incapacitating sprays

Passenger rights

If you are denied boarding or if your flight is cancelled or delayed for at least two hours, ask at your Bag Drop desk or boarding gate for the text stating your rights, particularly with regard to compensation and assistance. Regulation EC261/2004, Article 14(1).
